Transport Accident Commission

- The TAC is a Victorian Government-owned organisation set up to pay for treatment and benefits for people injured in transport accidents, promote road safety and improve Victoria's trauma system
- Invests in road safety initiatives such as awareness campaigns and education, enhanced enforcement and infrastructure improvement.
- Effective investment leads to reduced road trauma and therefore reduced liability for the TAC



Victoria's Safer Road Infrastructure Program (SRIP) - Overview

- \$1 billion over the next 10 years
- Victoria's largest road safety infrastructure program on record
- Funded by the Transport Accident Commission (TAC)
- Focus on intersection and run off road crashes

Treatments


- Run off road projects
 - Wire rope safety barrier
 - Guard fence
 - Sealed shoulders
 - Hazard removal or protection
 - Edgelines
 - Tactile centrelines
- Intersection projects
 - Traffic signals
 - Fully controlled right turns
 - Roundabouts
- Innovative projects







The SRIP Process



Proposals targeting intersection crashes and run off road crashes

- Requires minimum crash rates to be eligible
- Scanning of road network using Road Crash Information System
- More detailed analysis of individual sites
- Develop project proposals
- Crash Reduction Factors applied to proposed treatments
- Project priority determined on a road safety Benefit Cost Ratio

Crash Reductions - SRIP 1

Serious casualty crash reduction

Overall 31 ^o

Metropolitan	36%
Rural	28%

Intersection	48%
Run-off-road	27%


Crash Reductions - SRIP 2

Serious casualty crash reduction

Overall	44%

Metropolitan	47%
Rural	38%

Intersection	48%
Run-off-road	36%
